

#### **Problem:**

## Teens are dying & being injured in preventable crashes.

#### **Key Factors**

- Teens:
  - Lack awareness of risks
  - Inexperienced
  - Tend to act impulsively
- Parents:
  - Underestimate the danger
  - Underestimate their role or
  - Don't know what to do



#### **Traditional Solutions**

- Driver's Ed
  - Taken by less than 50%
  - Quality varies
  - Student engagement varies
- Youth Safety Groups
  - rural, issue-related, don't reach everyone
  - Not 'cool'
- Safety Presentations
  - Tend to focus on a specific issue



#### 'Sweet Life' Solution

#### The key is education:

- Teens
  - Provide 1 full day of free high quality driver education to every student
- Parents
  - Provide a free 1-hour interactive presentation and tools



## **Background**

- Piloted in 4 Mississauga high schools in Oct. 2013 (2 public, 2 Catholic)
- All 4 schools:
  - Annual program
  - Recommended to Board
- By end of June:
  - 11 teen events
  - 7 parent events



## The Sweet Life Road Show

- 2 Events in high schools
  - Teens
  - Parents
- Community Events
  - CAA
  - Ministry of Transportation
  - Police
  - EMS/ Fire
  - Public Health/Medical
  - Ontario Trucking Association
  - Private Corporations and Partners
  - An army of dedicated volunteers

- Grade 10 or 11
- Full Day
- 2 Parts:
  - The Strategy Stations
  - Taking Action on Distraction





#### Why choose this program?
